Where are the statistics in this report from?

This report includes selected findings from the National Core Indicators™ 2016-17 Surveys listed below.

The Adult Consumer Survey

This survey is completed with adults with I/DD age 18 and older receiving at least one paid service (in addition to case management/Service and Support Administration) from the local county board of DD agencies. The survey instrument includes a Background Information Section, which gathers data about the consumer from agency records, and two in-person survey sections. Section I includes subjective questions that can only be answered by the person receiving services. Section II includes objective, fact-based questions that can be answered by the person or, if needed, a proxy respondent who knows the person well.

The NCI Team produces reports that inform state efforts to strengthen policy, inform quality improvement activities, evaluate programs and policies, and compare their performance with national norms.
