

A person eligible for a Medicaid home and community-based services waiver is also eligible for services in an intermediate care facility.

About ICFs

An intermediate care facility is often called an ICF for short. ICFs are funded through Medicaid and provide 24-hour care for people who live there.

At least four people live in an ICF. The people who live there are all receiving some services. Services might include things like help getting dressed, learning new job skills, and help getting around.

About Waivers

Waivers are also funded through Medicaid. Waivers pay for services that people receive while living on their own, with family or with other people in their community, instead of living in an ICF.

You have the right to make choices about where you live.

You can choose to live in an ICF and get the services you need. Or you can choose not to live in an ICF and enroll in a waiver to get the services you need while you live in your community.
